(40% of boys singing in choir, boys as music leaders)</p>	<p>To use musical scheme charanga and access its resources for singing and vocal warm ups in addition to music lessons. (Music lessons, singing assemblies)</p> <p>To provide quality weekly singing assemblies. (Weekly on Thursdays)</p> <p>To provide a school choir club for KS2 children that runs weekly. (Weekly choir at lunch time)</p> <p>All staff will plan to include singing in their lessons at least once a week.
