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Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to Term Four. Thank you all for your support and flexibility at the end of last term. It wasn't quite the ending we had hoped for! I hope you all stayed safe during the storms. It was nice to see a few sunny days over the break and to begin to feel that spring is finally around the corner.

As you will be aware the government changed the regulations regarding COVID whilst school was closed. This is a brief summary of the changes from February 24th:

- The legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive Covid19 test has been removed.
- However, adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 days.
- After this time, individuals may choose to take two LFD tests 24 hours apart and return to the setting after two negative LFD tests have been taken.
- Daily testing for all known close contacts will no longer be recommended.
- All known unvaccinated contacts of a confirmed case will no longer be required to isolate.

The Local Authority anticipate that in most cases, parents and carers will agree that a pupil with the key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. However, If a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending school where they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, the headteacher can take the decision to refuse the pupil if it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.

I am sure that this will not be necessary at Gillingstool as we have worked very effectively together throughout the pandemic to keep our community safe and I have confidence that we will have your support to continue to do so.

With the changes in mind, we will be slowly moving away from our bubbles, with children returning to assemblies in person and, if that goes well, having lunch together in the hall. We still have our Contingency Plan in place, which means we are ready to address any outbreaks should they occur. We will continue to monitor any cases of COVID and seek advice from Public Health as needed. I hope this reassures you that we will still do all we can to minimise cases of COVID in school.
