### **COVID UPDATE**

We have seen a slight increase in cases over the first couple of weeks of term. Please keep being vigilant regarding the three key symptoms: **cough, temperature and loss of taste/smell**. **Anyone with symptoms should still get a PCR test**.

This is a brief reminder of the changes from February 24th:

- The legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive Covid19 test has been removed.
- However, adults and children who test positive will continue to be <u>advised to stay at home and avoid</u> <u>contact with other people for at least 5 days.</u>
- After this time, individuals may choose to take two LFD tests 24 hours apart and return to the setting
  after two negative LFD tests have been taken.
- Daily testing for all known close contacts will no longer be recommended.
- All known unvaccinated contacts of a confirmed case will no longer be required to isolate.

The Local Authority anticipate that in most cases, parents and carers will agree that a pupil with the key symptoms of COVID-19 should not attend the school, given the potential risk to others. However, if a parent or carer insists on a pupil attending school where they have a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, the headteacher can take the decision to refuse the pupil if it is necessary to protect other pupils and staff from possible infection with COVID-19.
